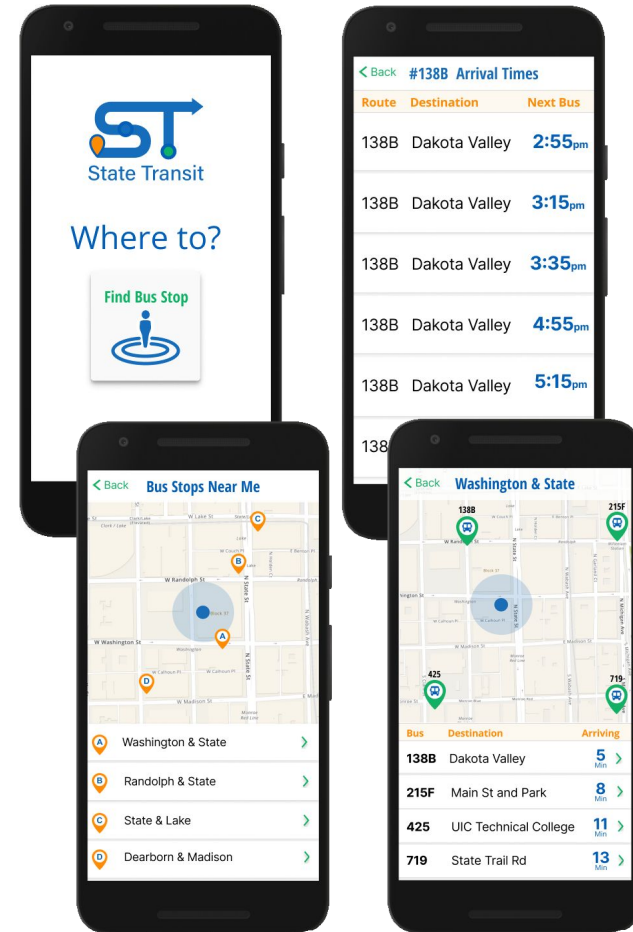


Accessibility Overview

- The blue was tested against the white background and passed with flying colors.
- The greens needed some work. I changed all of the green text and the green arrows to a slightly darker green so they would stand out against the white better. The larger icons for buses faired well in relation to size.
- The yellow icons were large enough to stand out in relation to text and could stand out on their own when reviewing all rules and arguments with accessibility checkers. I did make the blue letters inside the icons slightly darker to increase the contrast of both colors.



Accessibility Overview

- For physical disabilities the app uses:
 - Clear, adaptable layout and design - by using a simple, clear, uncluttered layout. Elements are clearly visible, even at high magnification.
 - Text, buttons, and other elements that are large and have high enough contrast.
 - Color to distinguish content.
 - Easy-to-follow navigation with clear and short task flows.
 - Navigation that's easy to find and consistent between pages.
 - Logical order to organize [age elements.
 - Descriptive headers to group related items.
 - Useful, unique, and descriptive labels to explain the purpose of each interactive element to users. To allow screen readers to properly explain the function of a particular control to users who rely on these services.
